











EXISTING CONDITION THE PILLARS OF BESA



Through an Olympic torch style procession, handheld illuminated beacons are brought to the museum from around the nation





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
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Toptani House as a Witness to History




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
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




Gallery: The Origin of Besa

In this room visitors can turn the pages of a large-format interactive digital book, based around the 12 sections of the Kanun. As a new page is selected, text and imagery associated with the each topic appears on the wall. In a long case on the opposite side, traditional objects associated with the Kanun are displayed.






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


Gallery: The Holocaust - Albanian Stories

After learning about the broader context of the Holocaust in the previous room, in this one they have an interpersonal encounter with both Holocaust survivors, and the Albanians who protected them. Full-height videos are activated when visitors come into close proximity, making it feel like the person is speaking directly to them.









Immersive Themed Spaces

The underground level explores how besa is understood and felt within the Albanian psyche. If the first floor is about how besa was manifest in the past, this one concerns how it is internalized in the present. The four pillars of protection, hospitality, honor, and tradition organize the key experiences.


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
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Gallery: Tradition


In a pre-opening process of community-building, members of the public will be invited to contribute an object that tells a story of besa. In this space, these are elegantly presented in an array of showcases. A short written blurb or audio recording explains why the person chose the artifact. These can be swapped out periodically, forming an ever-changing exhibit.


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Gallery: Honor

In his space, visitors make a pledge to uphold besa in a way that's meaningful to them. They use the touchscreen to select a favored example, or they can type in their own message. It then appears as part of a mosaic alongside those of other visitors. The message can also be shared beyond the walls of the space via social media.












Gallery: Hospitality

This space is a visitor-generated video and oral history archive. In the Share Your Story space next to this one, guests can record a short anecdote that captures an example of what besa means to them. In a striking space that features a skylight connected to the beacon above at ground level, the visitor's own movement around the room activates different stories.









Gallery: Protection


This space features an open cube with seating inside. The structure symbolizes the safety offered by a dwelling. When guests gather inside, the walls become brighter when viewed from the outside. The intensity of the light depends on the number of visitors inside. Guests listen to parts of the kanun related to the theme of protection being read aloud by people from different generations. This also appears on the walls as text.




This central gathering space is a contemporary version of the traditional oda on the first floor. Ever-changing patterns inspired by traditional carpet design appear in the central well and the ceiling. On the walls, a mosaic of personal stories from the past and present act as cues for dialogue—whether spontaneous or as part of a planned talk—in this social space.


Building the brand by building iconography.


The visual brand precedes the museum and is part of the community outreach and fundraising. The four Beacons become icons of Besa — both hard in representing protection and soft in representing hospitality. Visible across Tirana they will draw crowds.

The logotype is inspired Four Beacons that form Besa — the gradient play of light represents the intangible, ephemeral quality Besa as an ethos that continues to emanate from Albania. Contrasted by four solid forms that represent the tangible space of the Museum.

Visual Identity studies representing the four beacons. The light and gradient becomes a key motif.


